Please note that this 990 covers the activities of the entity incorporated as The Humane Society of the United States (The HSUS). The organization has several affiliates that file separate 990's including the Center for Respect of Life and the Environment (CRLE), Earthvoice International, Inc., Humane Society International (HSI), The National Association for Humane and Environmental Education (NAHEE), Meadowcreek, Inc., The HSUS Fund for Animals (HSUSFFA) and the Humane Society of the United States Wildlife Land Trust (WLT). For a combined report on the financial activities and status of The HSUS and its affiliates, interested persons may look at the organization's Annual Report on www.hsus.org.

PUBLIC EDUCATION, MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION AND PUBLICATIONS

Information and publications include material sent on a regular basis to HSUS constituents including a quarterly magazine to 350,000 members, an on-line newsletter to about 100,000 who have requested them, the only specialized magazine on animal sheltering issues, and a range of other specialist periodicals. The Media Relations department distributes national and local press releases on a full-range of animal protection and program issues, ranging from pet tips, to special events such as National Dog Bite Prevention Week, to legislative issues, to rewards offered in cruelty cases. The HSUS web site provides information on many of the issues addressed by the organization, as well as providing an avenue for direct action. The Animal Channel portion of the site, under the direction of the Video Project department, uses innovative technology to stream audio and video messages and news reports about animal issues. The video department produces an Internet "channel" also named Animal Channel, which is available to more than 60 million people, and also produces public service announcements, news and information video segments, and awareness videos for television, radio, and for use by activists and the general public.

Program Expense: \$34,586,299

Gifts and Grants: \$28,212

CRUELTY INVESTIGATIONS AND REGIONAL OFFICES

The Investigations department and our nine regional offices conduct national and local investigations into cruel and inhumane treatment of companion animals, farm animals, wildlife and animal fighting. HSUS investigations have led to the prosecution of some major figures in illegal dog fighting activities, in cock-fighting, and in hog-dog fights. They have also uncovered abuses in the transport, handling, and sale of horses for slaughter; in tax scams among people who write off the costs of their trophy hunting expeditions; in "canned" hunts where animals in enclosures are shot, among others. The HSUS conducted an 18 month long investigation into the killing of dogs and cats for fur that won national and international attention and was recently featured for its work in exposing canned hunting operations. Staff in the regional offices also played a major role in responding to the disasters caused by the hurricanes of 2004 and have helped with a range of other issues including animal hoarders (one case involved the rescue and rehabilitation of several hundred animals-mostly collies-from a truck trailer on the US/Canadian boarder), local cruelty cases that might need assistance from a national group, and animal fighting investigations.

Program Expense: \$5,945,404

Gifts and Grants: \$76,026

WILDLIFE, ANIMAL HABITAT AND SHELTERING

The Wildlife department protects wild animals through a range of activities. At present, the organization has active campaigns on fur and trapping-particularly developing a campaign to call attention to and stop Canada's annual slaughter of over 300,000 seals. The department also oversees programs on captive wildlife; wildlife refuges; endangered species; wildlife contraception; predator control; migratory birds; wild animals as pets; wild horses; marine mammals; and national and international wildlife issues. The department also houses one of the organization's signature programs-WILD NEIGHBORS. This program gives advice to people and municipalities who want to live in harmony with wildlife (such as beaver, Canada geese, raccoons, deer and many other species) and provides suggestions for humane management of conflicts between wild animals and people via a hot-line to help householders with their problems. The HSUS also maintains a Wildlife Rehabilitation and Training Center in Massachusetts. Through its other signature program PETS FOR LIFE, The HSUS provides materials that support and encourage the development of loving and rewarding companion animal-human bonds and also works with animal shelters and rescue groups to prevent animal suffering when that bond breaks. Our website provides numerous resources for the 60 million households that include companion animals while programs such as Animal Sheltering Magazine, Animal Shelter Consultation services and the annual Animal Care Expo provide advice, support and guidance to the animal-protection professionals who have hands-on responsibility for millions of animals and who work to improve the lives of animals who are our closets companions.

Program Expense: \$5,698,803

Gifts and Grants: \$1,224,408

LEGAL ASSISTANCE, LITIGATION, AND GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

The General Counsel's office provides legal assistance, guidance, and support to other HSUS departments, divisions, and offices on both animals programs and business matters. It also provides such assistance to other humane societies, HSUS members, and the HSUS board of directors. The HSUS government affairs department monitors federal, state and local legislation involving wild, captive, and domestic animals. In addition, the government affairs department seeks to educate constituents, the general public, government officials, and others on legislative matters concerning animal protection, and alerts concerned parties to legislation that will help, or harm animals. In 2004, the HSUS was involved in: the passage of 118 legislative initiatives in individual states; the passage of 8 legislative initiatives at the Federal level; and developing and fighting three state initiative petitions.

Program Expense: \$2,591,006

Gifts and Grants: \$313,800

Youth and Higher Education

Humane Society University provides work-force training programs under its own auspices and offers certificate and degree programs in conjunction with existing university partners. Humane Society Press provides a range of policy and educational materials of the highest quality on animal welfare issues. The National Association for Humane and Environmental Education distributes a million copies of its humane education newspaper (Kind News) every month to over ten percent of the elementary schools in the nation. Polls of the teachers who receive this newspaper reveal that over 90% welcome the newspaper and make use of it in their classrooms every month.

Program Expense: \$1,002,815

Gifts and Grants: \$8,550

Laboratory Bioethics and Farm Animals

The HSUS has two sections that focus specifically on laboratory animal and farm animal welfare. The organization is campaigning to eliminate pain and distress in animal studies, to promote student choice options (allowing students to opt out) when animals are used in educational programs, to stop the use of chimpanzees in laboratories, and to campaign against the use of animals to test BoTox cosmetic. Farm animal welfare is the biggest challenge for animal protection advocates today and The HSUS is supporting the three Rs of replacing animal products where possible, reducing the consumption of animal products, and refining the means by which animals may be raised so as to ensure the wellbeing of farm animals. To this end, the organization is supporting the development of new humane standards for raising farm animals, is working with animal scientists to promote more humane systems and approaching retailers to encourage them to use animal-friendly suppliers.

Program Expense: \$1,669,685

Gifts and Grants: \$66,263
