RESEARCH, INVESTIGATIONS & RESCUE - PETA receives complaints of cruelty to animals, rescues and obtains care for abused, neglected and at-risk animals, investigates cruelty cases, gathers evidence of law violations, and takes action to ensure enforcement of laws and regulations to protect the animals concerned. We publicized the results of our investigations into both the Australian live export trade, where sheep shipped to Egypt for slaughter were kicked, beaten, bound up and thrown into the trunks of cars, and killed in prolonged and cruel ways that are illegal in other countries, and a Covance animal-testing laboratory where workers hit, choked, and psychologically tormented monkeys. PETA persuaded Polo Ralph Lauren, J.
