## CHICKEN, PETS, AND FISHING COULD BE HISTORY

If the animal rights movement has its way, many of your favorite things could be history. Animal rightists want to eliminate chicken, hot dogs, hamburger, ice cream, cheese, and fish sticks. They're opposed to hunting and fishing. No more leather belts, wool socks, silk blouses. Goodbye to zoos, circuses, and your favorite pet.

Animal rights activists worldwide are attempting to impose their value system on the rest of us. They believe that animals are equal to people. As one animal rights leader puts it: "A rat is a pig is a dog is a boy."

The animal rights movement opposes the use of animals for food, clothing, medical research, entertainment, and even for companionship. It's an entirely new value system, and if they can't persuade you to adopt it, they'll try to intimidate you into accepting it.

Responsible people care about animal welfare. They want to see animals treated humanely. But animal welfare isn't what the animal rights movement is after. So ... the next time you see an animal rights protest on the street, remember what these people really want. Whether they're opposing meat or medical research, zoos or fur, their real agenda goes much further.

The next time anyone asks you for support of bills to "help animals" make sure your support won't be used to promote a value system that puts animals ahead of people and condones or actively supports the use of violence as a means to an end.

Their protests and actions make it clear: if animal rights activists prevail, you won't be eating chicken, going fishing, or enjoying pets – you'll be reading about them ... in the history books.



*Here's how animal rights leaders describe their plans*

- ⊙ "Our goal: to convince people to rescue and adopt instead of buying or selling animals, to disavow the language and concept of animal ownership." – *Eliot Katz, In Defense of Animals website, 2001*
- ⊙ "We have no problem with the extinction of domestic animals." – *Wayne Pacelle, Vice-President, Humane Society of the US, formerly with Fund for Animals in Animal People, May, 1993*
- ⊙ "If we really believe that animals have the same right to be free from pain and suffering at our hands, then, of course we're going to be blowing things up and smashing windows.... I think it would be great if all of the fast-food outlets, slaughterhouses, these laboratories, and the banks that fund them exploded tomorrow. I think it's perfectly appropriate for people to take bricks and toss them through the windows. ... Hallelujah to the people who are willing to do it." – *PeTA's Bruce Friedrich, at the Animal Rights 2001 conference, July 2001*
- ⊙ "Our nonviolent tactics are not as effective. We ask nicely for years and get nothing. Someone makes a threat, and it works." – *Ingrid Newkirk, PeTA, US News and World Report, April 8, 2002*
- ⊙ "There is so much blood on this chicken-killer's hands, a little more on his business suit won't hurt." *Bruce Friedrich, PETA Director of Vegan Outreach, PETA news release, June 23, 2003.*
- ⊙ "Breeders must be eliminated! ... If you know of a breeder in the Los Angeles area, whether commercial or private, legal or illegal, let us know and we will post their name, location, phone number so people can write them letters telling them 'Don't Breed or Buy, While Others DIE.'" *"Breeders! Let's get rid of them too!" Campaign on Animal Defense League's website, September 2, 2003.*



*Here's how animal rights leaders are implementing their plans:*

**January 26, 2003:** At the National Conference on Organized Resistance at American University, convicted arsonist Rodney Coronado showed the audience how to build a cheap incendiary device. "Here's a little model I'm going to show you here. ... It is a simple plastic jug, which you fill with gasoline and oil. ... You put the incense stick in here, light it, place it -- underneath the 'weapon of mass destruction,' light the incense stick ... and you destroy the profits that are brought about through animal and earth abuse. That's about -- two dollars." Coronado also said, "You know, those people - I think they should appreciate that we're only targeting their property. Because frankly I think it's time to start targeting them."

Such incendiary devices have been found at restaurants and laboratories under assault in anti-meat and anti-research campaigns.

**In March 2003,** People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals launched "Holocaust on your Plate," a six-panel display comparing the slaughter of chickens to the murder of six million Jews in German death camps.

**Also in 2003,** animal rights criminals stole chickens and ducks from farms, vandalized a veal processing plant, targeted a Los Angeles animal shelter director, released thousands of mink from fur farms, and threatened dozens of scientists who work with animals.

**In May 2002, PeTA** hired Gary Yourofsky to head its school lecture program. Yourofsky served jail time for stealing mink and is a frequent proponent of violence in the cause of animal rights. Here's what he told the *Toledo Blade* less than a year earlier\*:

- ⊙ "Do not be afraid to condone arsons at places of animal torture."
- ⊙ If an "animal abuser" were killed in a research lab firebombing, "I would unequivocally support that, too."
